

OP 70.05: FEDERAL PROPERTY AT MISSISSIPPI STATE UNIVERSITY

PURPOSE

The State of Mississippi has stringent requirements regarding property. Additionally, the Federal Government relies on and requires Mississippi State University to provide effective and efficient stewardship of the Federal Government property in its custody as a regionent of research funds and federal excess property. The Federal Acquisition Regulation (EAR), Uniform Guidance (UG), and Federal Excess Personal Property (FEPP) provide guidance to educational institutions for property furnished by the Federal Government expurchased with federal funds. Appropriate definitions are provided in the *Sponsored Property Management Procedures Manual* (https://www.property.msstate.edu/propertyneanuals) and *MSU-MAFES Federal Surplus Property Internal Guidelines* (https://www.mdfes.msstate.edu/faculty-staff/pdf/MSU-MAFES-Federal-Surplus-Property.pdf), and included in this policy by reference. This policy shall provide by reference, Mississippi State University's procedures to protect, preserve, account for, control, and use of government property in its custody.

PROCESS

Processes for the acquisition, utilization, investory, reporting and disposition of government property are required for an institution having government-titled property in their custody to protect, preserve, account for, control, and use the property for its intended purpose. These processes for Mississippi State are certained in the *Sponsored Property Management Procedures Manual and MSU MASES Federal Surplus Property Internal Guidelines*.

APPROVALS

The Office of Navai Research (ONR), an executive branch agency within the Department of Defense, is the federal authority for determining the compliance with federal regulations of Mississippi State Deriversity's government property control system by conducting periodic reviews, either through desk review or on-site Property Control System Analysis (PCSA).

Public baw 97.98 enables the National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) to loan FERP to State and County Extension Services, State Agricultural Experiment Stations, accedited colleges of veterinary medicine, and cooperating forestry schools to further the purposes of the cooperative agricultural research and extension programs.

NONCOMPLIANCE

Noncompliance with the processes and procedures contained in the *Sponsored Property Management Procedures Manual and MSU-MAFES Federal Surplus Property Internal Guidelines* can result in Property Control System Audit exceptions, fines for serious or repeated noncompliance, and suspension of Mississippi State University from receiving federal funds and property.
